WHAT IS AN HONORS COURSE?

An Honors Course is an approved transferable general education course, with an honors component. Honors Program professors enhance basic curriculum requirements of their classes by offering more intensive study than is possible in the regular sections. The Honors sections are intended to foster discussion, a mastery of content, critical thinking and analysis.

An English 101 Honors course, for example, will be reflected as English 101 honors on your transcript.

HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Have a 3.0 grade point average in a minimum of 9 units of degree applicable courses.
- Be eligible for English 101
- Submit two letters of recommendations from instructors
- Complete an application to the Honors Program
- Be interviewed by the Honors Director

High school students are invited to complete an application and see the Honors Director.

HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM COMPLETION

The College Honors designation is awarded to transferring or graduating students who complete the following requirements:

- Minimum of 15 units of Honors coursework - five designated Honors classes.
