CHEM 212-Organic Chemistry For Science Majors II (UC/CSU) - 5 Units

Requirement Designation: Meets Cal-GETC-5A or 5C

Enrollment Requirement: Chemistry 211

This course is a continuation of Chemistry 211 with emphasis on the remaining functional groups and aromaticity. Emphasis is put on reactions and reaction mechanisms, stereochemistry, multi-step synthesis of a variety of organic compounds such as aromatic compounds, alcohols, phenols, amines, heterocyclics, aldehydes, ketones, carboxylic acids and their derivatives. The structures, formation and reactions of enoles and enolate anions are also studied. The structures and functional group reactions of biological molecules such as carbohydrates, amino acids, polypeptides, lipids and nucleic acids are discussed. The laboratory work presents more techniques of multi-step synthesis, isolation, purification, and analysis of organic compounds using conventional and modern instrumental methods. This course also emphasizes the use and interpretation of Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR), Infrared (IR), Mass Spectroscopy (MS), Ultraviolet (UV), and Gas Chromatograph (GC) in the
